Sports Day information

Sports day will be held on Friday 15th June, weather permitting, and will take the same format as previous years.

Morning - Track events.

These will consist of competitions between classes for each year group, including sprint races/relays, egg and spoon relay and bean-bag relay (the latter two being new this year). It will start at approximately 9:15 am, though parents

may gather in the spectator area after morning drop-off. Seating is provided alongside the track.

Afternoon - House team activities
