Learning updates from around our school

Year 3 visit to Colchester Zoo

Year 3 enjoyed a day at Colchester Zoo on Wednesday as part of their current learning about habitats and animal adaptation. Each class participated in a workshop session with one of the zoo's education officers where they considered how animals adapt to their environment in order to survive and thrive. Despite its size and variety of species in residence, the classes managed to get around most of the zoo and see a wide variety of animals up close. The pupils' behaviour and representation of Barnes Farm was very pleasing. Thank you to all the parent volunteers who offered their time and effort to attend.



Year 4 learn about the body

Year 4 are learning about the body this term and have started weekly sessions this half term with 'Body Care', an organisation who teach about healthy lifestyles and diets through a variety of practical activities and first hand experiences.

Year 4 also benefited from a general first aid training session on Friday morning taught by the St John Ambulance Service. This covered some basic skills to enable them to make a difference in a first aid emergency, including how to put someone into the recovery position.

Year 5 line dancing

Some pupils from Year 5 began to learn the moves for a line dance so that they can take part in a local show at the civic theatre in July. As well as being great fun and an element of the PE (dance) curriculum, this also contributes to their current topic about Texas (a geographical study of a North American locality). We look forward to seeing this in assembly one day soon!

Year 6 visit to the Isle of Wight

Year 6 departed on Monday for their residential visit to the Isle of Wight. They had a very successful and enjoyable trip, visiting such places as Osborne House, Amazon World and Robin Hill Country Park as well as taking part in interesting activities such as surfing and a theatre workshop. We look forward to welcoming them back to school today and hearing all about their trip in the coming days - it hasn't been the same without them! Year 6 also stopped in the middle of their activities on the Isle of Wight at the same time to show their respects and thoughts.

Mr McIntosh talked to the children in Years 3-5 on Monday morning at the end of assembly about the silence; as before, the information shared was basic and brief, so that parents can decide how much and in what way to discuss the events:

- The school will be observing a 1-minute silence on Tuesday in the same way we did a couple of weeks ago
- This is to remember all those who were affected by an attack that happened late at night on Saturday in the centre of London
- We show togetherness as a country and our respect and compassion towards others by doing this

Miss Rudkin's assembly on Monday referred to the concert in Manchester on Sunday evening and how people can come together to show unity, strength, resilience and compassion in spite of events such as the Manchester attack.
