We would also like to thank our wonderful catering staff who stayed behind and cooked up a feast for all to sample and enjoy.

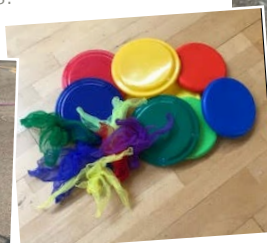
Year 2 Trip - The Wilderness Foundation

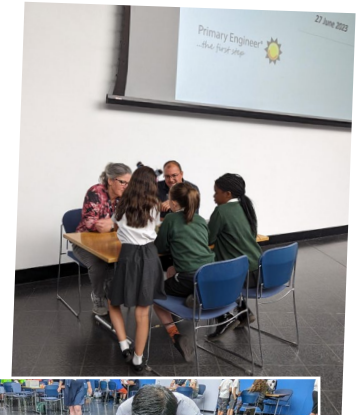

District Sports Champions!

We are delighted to report that our athletics team recently won the District Sports Track and Field Competition, held at Chelmsford Sports and Athletic Centre. Children from Year 6 competed in the field events on Monday 19th June where all six participants were placed in the top three for their events: throwing, high jump and long jump.

On Monday 26th June, children from years 3 to 6 competed in the track events. The opening races provided us some inspiring individual performances from the year 6 pupils who ran the 600m. This was followed by the sprint races. Year 3 and 4 pupils ran 60m sprints, year 5 and 6 ran 80m sprints. Despite the pressure, each sprinter performed with confidence, achieving first or second place in almost all races. The competition closed with the Year 6 relays. Both boys and girls came in at second place. After an extremely tense wait, Barnes Farm Junior School were announced as the winners - the team were overjoyed. This was an extremely proud moment for the pupils, parents and teachers. The event was an excellent opportunity for the children to experience competition at a major sporting venue used by elite athletes and in front of a large crowd. We scheduled our Sports Day earlier in the term this year to avoid the heat – and it was still a very hot, but brilliant, day! We had such a good turn out from parents and our

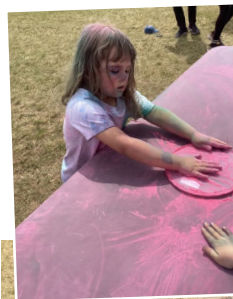


pupils were all fantastic in their various events, including shooting in goal with goalie parents, basketball, egg and spoon races and parachute games.

Tyrrells 60th Birthday

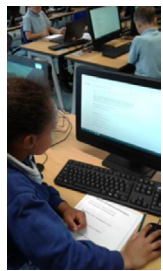
A huge thank you to all those who contacted us with photos of their time at Tyrrells.
