Park and Stride Launch



This week, alongside the Infant school, we launched Park and Stride. Leaflets were taken home on Wednesday with more information about this with a digital version found at the bottom of this newsletter. Park and Stride is based at Asda where there are lots of free parking spaces (for up to 3 hours) and it counts as an active journey for the WOW badges. It also greatly reduces congestion directly outside of school which helps us to ensure it is safe for our families to bring their children to school.

Please continue to park considerately and refrain from parking opposite the Clarence Close junction on Henniker Gate and on the bend near the school. There was significant disruption after school today due to cars parking on the bends and illegally, on double yellow lines. We ask that you think carefully about where you choose to park so we can continue to keep our pupils safe and prevent frustrating local residents. There is clear signage in place on the bends and *'The Highway Code explains that double yellow lines "indicate a prohibition of waiting at any time even if there are no upright signs."* This includes any amount of the double line you choose to park your car on.



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The South Essex Parking Partnership (SEPP) are extremely pleased to announce a new Park and Stride for Barnes Farm Infant and Junior School.

The Park and Stride will be located at Asda Supermarkets car park just down the road from the school. It has taken some time for us to complete due to some staff changes at Asda. But we can confirm that parents can now park here but they do still have to abide by current car park regulations set out by ParkingEye.

This new scheme will give parents a safe space to park near the school and walk or scoot their children from there to the school. It will help keep the roads and neighbouring properties less congested and make the area a much safer place for parents and children to enter and leave the school.

We must stress that as stated above any parents using the Park and Stride must apply by the car park regulations. If parents are penalised for irresponsible parking or not abiding by the regulations set out SEPP are not liable.
