General Election - School to remain open



The Junior School has once more been designated as a polling station for the upcoming General Election. We always do everything we can to remain open on these occasions but as you know, some elections in the past have caused us to close when we cannot make arrangements that guarantee the security of the whole school site, including the Infant School.

In this instance, we are pleased to be able to remain open, due to agreement to our request for a mobile unit to be sited in our car park. This will enable us to retain the secure integrity of the school grounds, while fulfilling our obligations as a polling station, and at no extra cost to the school. It should be noted for future reference that the local electoral services are making this arrangement for this election only, given its unexpected nature and challenging timing, and it may not be repeated on future occasions.

All children are therefore to attend school as normal on Thursday 12th December.

Year 2-Year 3 admissions for September 2020

Parents of current Year 2 children at all Essex infant schools need to make a formal application to the council in order for them to transfer to another school, including their linked Junior School. The admission process opened on 11 November 2019, for parents to apply for a Year 3 place for September 2020 via the website www.essex.gov.uk/admissions. The statutory national closing date for applications is 15 January 2020.

Congratulations to all the children that took part and thank you to Mr Williams and Mrs Sheridan for accompanying them.














Autumn first half term Home Learning
