Year 3 visit to Barleylands Farm



On Wednesday, Year 3 visited Barleylands Farm as part of their Stone Age topic. They enjoyed a ride on a tractor in order to see crops being grown and were also informed about how Stone Age people would have farmed the land using different tools. The children were thrilled to see the farm animals up close, learning about animal domestication in what was called the 'New' Stone Age. Some pupils even had the chance to feed the sheep and goats! Indoor activities included cooking Stone Age stew and making bread rolls by hand, learning about 'emmer wheat' - the first wheat cultivated in the Stone Age, and replicating Stone Age art using charcoal. A busy and informative day was experienced by all which has helped begin Year 3's new topic in an exciting and memorable way.
