## Class Structure Policy

We can confirm that the staff and Governors have agreed to continue the arrangements for implementing our Class Structure policy in the Summer term. This is because we continue to seek to achieve the following objectives:

- ✓ *To create opportunities for children to learn and play with a wider variety of peers*
- ✓ *To enable greater social interaction between children as they move through the school*
- ✓ *To ensure that the classes remain balanced in response to pupil transfer and transition during phases*
- ✓ *To promote a greater sense of community in a large three-form entry school*

We will do this by consulting the children (Y2-Y5) on who they think they work best with (over the May half term) as well as the teachers considering the following criteria:

- Gender and age
- Range of educational, social and personal needs
- Level of maturity and attitudes to learning
- Friendships
