BFJS—Remaining Positive, Respectful and Responsible

As a general rule, our school is an orderly, safe place, where relationships between staff and visitors, especially parents/carers, demonstrate mutual respect and recognition of our shared responsibility for pupils' welfare and educational progress. Parental involvement is an important factor in educational success and in dealing with emerging problems at an early stage.

However, on occasion, the behaviour of a few parents/ carers can cause severe disruption or worse, resulting in abusive or aggressive behaviour towards staff, pupils, or other members of the school community. Unfortunately, there has been one such occasion this week which affected staff, other parents and most concerning of all, pupils. This has led to a sanction being applied.

All these members of the school community have a right to expect that our school is a safe place in which to work and learn. There is no place for violence, threatening behaviour or abuse in our school. Where such behaviour does occur, we will take one or all of the following actions:

1. Meet with the parent to outline our concerns
2. Write to the parent to outline our expectations
3. Request that the parent leaves the site immediately
4. Revoke the parent's implied licence to come on to the school premises either temporarily or in the most severe of cases, indefinitely
5. Prosecute under Section 547 of the Education Act 1996 if trespassing persists

Thankfully, this behaviour at our school is extremely rare but threatening or abusive incidents have been increasing and it is up to us all as a community to model how to deal positively, respectfully and responsibly with disagreements where they may occur.
