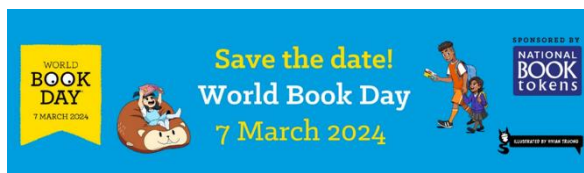
World Book Day 2024

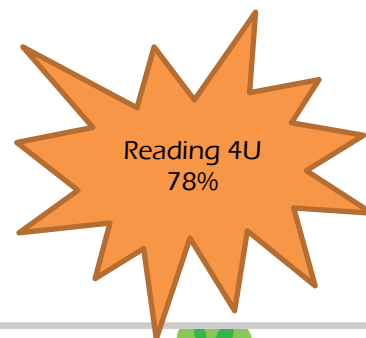
