

## Local MP to visit school on International Women's Day, Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> March

We are pleased to announce that we will be receiving a visit to school from our local MP, Vicky Ford. She has been invited to attend on International Women's Day in order to recognise 2018 being the centenary when women in the UK won the right to vote. Observing this significant occasion is part of our wider commemoration of the centenary of the end of World War 1, which will be recognised in several ways this calendar year.

Mrs Ford will be meeting the whole school in an assembly and give a brief talk about her work as an MP, both at parliament and in the constituency. She will also answer some prepared questions from our pupils. After the assembly, she will be opening our new 'mile a day' track which is being laid in our grounds after half term. This is a new resource which will be used by classes most days in an effort to encourage and increase the amount of physical activity undertaken by our pupils.
