

During half-term, Mr McIntosh had the opportunity and privilege to represent our school on a visit to China. This was arranged and largely funded in partnership with the British Council and Hanban (China's equivalent of the British Council). The purpose of the visit was:

- to establish and develop a link between our school and a school in China
- to inspire and promote Mandarin and Chinese culture teaching and learning in school
- to explore the education system and curriculum in China and what may be of use to enhance our own system and curriculum
- to investigate ways in which to enhance professional development of staff

Mr McIntosh was one of 60 delegates on the trip from the UK, 7 of whom were from primary and secondary schools in Essex. Time was spent in Beijing and in Changshu, where Mr McIntosh visited the Changshu Zhangqinglian Primary School, observing lessons, talking to teachers and children, exploring resources and experiencing Chinese culture. The beginning of a formal link was established which we hope will grow into a mutually beneficial partnership next year, complementing and enriching our knowledge and understanding of this culturally fascinating and politically and economically important country. Mr McIntosh has already talked to the whole school about some of his experiences in an assembly, with much more to be shared in future assemblies. A display about the trip and the school in Changshu is soon to be put up and we are already planning a special China themed week in February to link in with the Chinese New Year. More details to follow!

Local residents have once again been in touch with both Junior and Infant schools to raise concerns about isolated (yet significant) incidents of dangerous driving, prohibited parking and inconsiderate behaviour experienced in the last few weeks.
