## Parking

In the last week, both Barnes Farm schools have again been contacted by local residents about the parking situation outside the schools. The main concerns are the ways in which cars are being parked in the neighbouring roads and how dangerous some of these habits are to pedestrians and other cars and their passengers. We have witnessed many drivers parking on double yellow lines, on bends and far up pavements.

In a school zone with children of all ages and their families walking around, **it is more important** to have excellent driving and parking practices, **not less important**. The Junior School had a visit from a 3PR speaker last Friday in assembly, who asked the children if they had recently witnessed different poor parking behaviours such as those already outlined. Disappointingly, more hands went up than not each time, showing that most of our children are noticing the examples being set (not all necessarily from their own parents, of course).

When driving and parking is necessary, please ensure it is done safely, legally and with consideration to our neighbours. Should you wish to use it, ASDA still allows parents from the Barnes Farm Schools to park in their car park (back zone) so that the surrounding roads are not impacted quite so adversely.
