The New National Curriculum


From September 2014, our school became subject to a new National Curriculum. I would like to share some examples of how this has had an impact this term so far. For more information, please do explore the 'Teaching and Learning' area of our website. This contains information on our objectives and plans for every area of the curriculum and is building all the time. This year, Y3-Y5 are particularly governed by the changes to the curriculum. The children have been working in a more 'cross-curricular' way where their writing, in particular, has benefited from using History or Science for example as a particular focus. The Y5 class assemblies this term have been particularly rich examples of how this revised approach is having an impact. I hope that your child is talking about work in class with greater enthusiasm as the staff certainly are!



Year 3 have been very excited about their 'Big Dig' and decoding Anglo-saxon runes. Y4 have immersed themselves in their Bright Sparks theme and are now investigating 'Who were the greatest builders of all time?'. Y5 have been led by a Science investigation into Space and are now using WW1 as a prompt for many of their activities.

Finally, 'Computing' has replaced ICT and the children in Y5/6 have been learning how to code using 'Scratch'. This skill is certainly challenging for some (including staff) but is proving very popular and rewarding for the pupils. I look forward to sharing more information in the Spring Term on how we are engaging our pupils so that they have a thirst for knowledge and a love of learning.
