

BFJS Continuing through Covid

Please find attached to this newsletter, a communication to all parents about how and when to contact the school about a positive Covid-19 case when the school is closed. We now have a new email address to use - covidcontact@barnesfarm-jun.essex.sch.uk. Certain classes have been recently affected directly by this virus and we are taking all the necessary steps to follow the guidance from Public Health England in order to keep everyone as safe as possible. It is such a difficult time for our school community, but the manner in which our children and staff (in particular) are responding is tremendous and makes me very proud as a headteacher. Nationally, the school attendance rate is 86%. So the fact that our attendance is at 96.8%, given the challenges, fears and anxieties that each and every family has, is testament to the commitment of families and staff to providing education throughout such a difficult time. It is also clear that the protective measures that we currently have (click [here](#) to find out more about these) is minimising

and preventing the further spread of this virus across our community. Thank you all for your continued diligence in following the guidance. A recent webinar that I took part in with Mike Gogarty, Essex head of Public Health England, certainly highlighted the worrying fact that Essex saw little impact on the overall infection rate despite second lockdown. Therefore, we need to heed the public guidance over the coming weeks in order to best protect ourselves and others from this indiscriminate virus. The Lord of the Rings quote seems more relevant than ever as we look towards a more positive 2021.


Remote Learning Success



We also received lots of helpful suggestions which we are reviewing and will consider putting in place for the future. Thank you once more to any parents of pupils involved in remote learning for their effort, time and patience in helping the children access lessons - we really appreciate working in partnership with you.

We collected evaluations from staff across the school as well and they have identified some good practice for individual pupil absences, as follows:

Remote learning good practice - individual cases

- Remote learning is for a child's absence due to coronavirus-related reasons **only**. Pupils who are otherwise off school due to illness must rest/recuperate or return to school if well.

- The teacher's main priority is to teach and manage the children in front of them in the classroom but remote set-up will happen as soon as we can achieve it. Reporting the absence on Studybugs in detail will help to speed this up in the morning.
- We will share audio and computer presentations in the live stream - no video should be shared either way.
- The system has some limitations and we appreciate your patience and understanding if an aspect such as sound is not of a brilliant quality.
- If parents need to discuss something with the teacher, please call or send an eSchools message. Teachers are not expected to respond during a lesson and the Teams chat function should just be used for lesson-specific questions.
- Only Teachers and LSAs should be inviting pupils to the lessons.
- Please remember to disconnect when leaving the lesson meeting.
