Junior Music Festival



Barnes Farm Junior choir have been working hard since Christmas, learning repertoire for the Junior Music Festival. This annual event has running for many, many years but hasn't happened for the last 4 years due to the pandemic so it was a long-anticipated return which the children were excited to be a part of. The children had a long list of songs to learn, ranging from classical pieces to pop songs through the ages and included classic staples such as: Lambeth Walk, Rocket Man, Mr Blue Sky, Rainy Days and Mondays, We don't talk about Bruno and Don't stop, to name but a few! There was some British Sign Language to learn for one of the classical pieces too. Unfortunately, we were not able to attend the rehearsal for this event due to the prohibitive cost of coach bookings, so the children's first experience of the brilliant choir mistress, Natalie, was on the day of the concert itself. The children joined 5 other schools to fully rehearse each song with piano accompaniment in the morning and a 'band' in the afternoon. The band consisted of electric guitar and drums alongside the piano. The children had a full 'runthrough' in the afternoon so they would know the

running order of the evening's performance and could get a feel for the lighting on the stage too! It was exciting for them to see the workings of the backstage area and to walk through the 'wings' to get to their places. They rehearsed walking on and off the stage and lining up outside before a syncopated walk-on to get them where they needed to be on the rostram.

After a few hours off to rest we were back at the theatre and lining up again back-stage ready for the actual concert. The children's behaviour throughout the day can only be described as impeccable and they really did Barnes Farm and themselves proud. They gave their all throughout out the day, singing their hearts out with pure joy and exhilaration on their faces. Miss Rudkin and I watched the concert from the side of the stage and found it rather emotional at one or two points, we couldn't help but sing along too! I had chosen two year 6 girls to be soloists at the start of the concert and they bravely stood on stage with other soloists in front of the curtain to sing the opening section of one of the classical pieces, before the curtain was raised to reveal the coir of joint schools waiting behind. Natalie was a charismatic and talented conductor, as well as compere for the evening. She had the audience in the palm of her hand from the beginning and lots of fun ensued. There was a solo cellist who played during the concert to give the children a break so they had another experience there that they might not have heard and probably not experienced 'live' before.

The choir are a small but varied group of children, and I was so pleased with their performance on the day which only goes to highlight what a brilliant uniting force music is. It's accessible to everyone. The children have understandably been tired today but were full of the joy and desperate to share their experiences with their class teachers, friends and at our choir practise today. I have had lots of lovely feedback from parents who were in the audience. I hope this now marks a return to many more musical experiences for children at Barnes Farm.
